General:

To provide a point of contact for anyone within the club who feels the need for advice or support on any issue and if or when appropriate, arrange for access to this to be made available.

The Welfare officer will ideally have significant experience and/or professional qualification in Health, Social Care, Counselling or closely allied discipline.
